ENGAGE: SPIRITUAL FORMATION QUESTIONS

1. Think about a time when someone overwhelmed you with an act of lavish generosity. What touched you most deeply about that act?
2. God is the author of enjoyment, including the enjoyment of material blessings. Read Deuteronomy 14:22-26 and 16:13-15. What does God instruct his people to do as a part of these festivals? In what way do these instructions surprise you?
3. How do you react to the fact that God not only allowed but *mandated* these times of celebration--and even used a portion of the people's tithe to underwrite them? How does this challenge your view of God?
4. Consider the following statement: "More than almost any other area of our life, our handling of money and possessions reveals what we believe--not what we *say* we believe, but what we *really* believe." Being as candid as possible, what would you say you really believe concerning the faithful generosity of God?
5. In what tangible, generous and hospitable ways can you live out "What Can I Do God?" this coming week?
